STAND 41: New Daisyfield & King Street - OO Gauge Stephanie Dearden Daisyfield is a class 14X (Pacer) Traincare Depot based in Blackburn next to the East Lancashire Coach builder's factory. Set in the early days of privatisation, ELC won the contract to maintain the Pacer fleet throughout Lancashire. This was done to take the pressure off Newton Heath who were busy still maintaining the ageing first generation DMU fleet. There is a small 4 platform terminal station serving King Street, the City's main shopping centre, two major Breweries, Government buildings and Civic Offices. Part of the railway land sidings have been replaced with an Aldi and a Car Park (inspired by Tooting Jct) The Traincare depot consist of a two-road maintenance shed and fuelling point, and three train care sidings. Nearby there is a Royal mail PCD, a Coach builder's and Railfreight Distribution vard. A P-Way depot runs alongside with a stable of welfare and tool vehicles (inspired by Tulse Hill). Regular traction is a Multitude of classes 140, 142, 144, 150, 156, 158/9, 170 & 221. Liveries include Regional, Trans-Pennine, X-Country and rare visitors from other regions. King Street served as a coal yard for over a century and is now BBK maintenance depot. Daisyfield was once a Coal yard and is now a school next to the Junction for the Ribble Valley Line to Hellifield. GRES was formed in 1970 by a group of enthusiasts with an interest in transport and railways in particular. The tradition carries on today, over 50 years later, with interests as diverse as shipping, buses and trams; plus, our two model railway layouts – Gravesend West and Windmill Hill.

We usually hold 20 meetings a year, at the Emmanuel Baptist Church in Windmill Street Gravesend, with speakers on a wide range of transport related subjects. There is also the "GRES Journal", published ten times a year and an annual coach outing; plus, visits to other railway and transport sites. Further details appear on the inside cover of the programme.

STAND 3: New Bridge Street – OO Gauge River Model Railway Club

A busy locomotive shed somewhere in London with a selection of motive power waiting between duties undergoing light maintenance and refueling. Tube trains provide an intensive service at a lower level.

Track and point motors are from Peco; rolling stock is from a variety of manufacturers and kit suppliers.

STAND 5: Gravesend West – OO Gauge

A OO Gauge layout that depicts Gravesend West station and the surrounding area, including freight yard and sidings. It has provided a good starting point to improve and expand into a working layout depicting the second station in Gravesend that once boasted a named boat train from London before the Second World War. Closed to passengers in 1953 and finally to freight in 1968, nothing remains of the station or the extended line to the pier - except the pier itself which may be turned into a visitor attraction. A model of the pier has been constructed as part of the layout.



STAND 37: Lenham – N Gauge Andrew Town

Lenham station opened on the 1<sup>st</sup> July 1884 as part of the London, Chatham and Dover Railway`s extension of the line from Maidstone to Ashford West. The station building was constructed like all the stations built east of Maidstone, using red brick and was based on the design of the "Bat and Ball" station building, as erected at Sevenoaks.

The goods yard comprised of four sidings on the upside, occupied by the coal and seed company L.J. Clark and Co, and one on the downside. All of this was controlled by a Saxby and Farmer signal box, a part brick, part wooden building positioned just beyond the western end of the up platform. One of the sidings served a goods shed, which was used by the Morello Cherry Brandy works and later the Spears bacon factory. The trackside warehousing was the property of Milnes Baskets, until it was purchased along with the old bacon factory by Reginald Tolhurst who founded the Lenham Storage Company in 1946. The company still occupy the site today.

Apart from the replacement of name boards, little changed at this station under Southern Railway ownership, major layout alterations were carried out under the ownership of British Railways.

The model depicts the era leading up to 1961, just as the Kent Coast Electrification Scheme was coming into play. This was when the new footbridge was built at the Western end of the station, replacing the old foot crossing at the eastern end of the platforms. The down siding had been extended to form a passing loop, but the up line had still to have its passing loop installed through the goods yard at the rear of the up platform, as the goods shed had yet to be demolished to make way for it.

The Layout depicts a typical Urban London scene around the early 1950's period, where signs of the closure of London's tramways, (July 1952) are slowly appearing with one of the new trolleybuses which will replace the trams on the more suburban routes, on show on the depot forecourt, and buses in evidence, slowly taking over some of the more central area tram routes, another sign is the old tram depot has been put up for sale for redevelopment. The layout shows the trams using the underground 'Conduit' system of power collection, favoured in the busy central areas of London.

This layout is totally battery operated, under basic analogue control.

The trains were withdrawn in 1971, and only two coaches from one of the units remain both in poor condition and in need of some care and attention. Web: www.4sub4732.co.uk/ The 4-SUB Association (4SA) was formed to promote the project to restore unit 4732. In conjunction with the Heritage Electric Trains Trust, the owners and project managers of 4732, the 4SA's role is to provide support in fundraising, promotion and 'hands on' assistance. STAND 24: Kingstag - N Gauge Paul King Kingstag is a N Gauge Southern Railway Countryside Station loosely based on the actual village of Kings Stag which sits in the Dorset countryside, but the village was never to have its own station. Nearest one being Blandford where the American Army was stationed during World War two, then after the war the REME took over residence of the camp, closing early 1960's after conscription ceased to be a requirement. station taking the villagers to shops further down the line, children trying to get home from school by coach. The coal yard in full swing with lorries in and out and coal wagons bringing in more supplies.

The village scene is a wedding taking place outside the church, regular steam trains and electrification of the railway has just been completed and a small 2BIL set will be seen meandering in and out of the Cattle wagons being emptied.

STAND 25: Relham - N Gauge Andrew Jeffervs

This is my first layout since childhood, it was bought second hand and several hours have been spent increasing the level of detail and functionality. The layout is modelled around a small town with a branch line that is currently transitioning from steam to diesel. These are a few features that have been hidden within the layout including escaping sheep and a secret bunker.

I have spent a lot of time retrofitting motorised points and working signals to the layout to increase the level of interest and I feel that although it has been a steep learning curve it will hopefully encourage those thinking of getting into the hobby that it is possible to create a reasonable layout whilst learning different skills.

An, as yet unnamed 'N' gauge modular layout, still under development, being constructed within a series of A4 box-files. The concept is to produce a layout capable of being transported in a small car The core layout consists of two modules, each of three linked box-files - the station and the fiddle yard. Other modules can be inserted between these provided the entry/exit points are matched, enabling variable configurations depending on available space at exhibitions. The name derives from the old Kentish word 'bear' meaning 'near' or 'close to' and the Lee, a small stream that runs near (or bear) flowing into the Stour near Sturry in Kent. The input side is serviced by Bearlee Works East Yard which you can't see from here. The works has produce various things over the years but is now principally a distribution centre for agricultural products and machinery parts.  The model is the familiar "Inglenook Sidings" design which lends itself to many interpretations. It is built to the scale of 7mm/foot, known as O Gauge.
